### Bataan Leaves Dry Dock, Moors Pierside

**PORTSMOUTH, Va.** – The multi-purpose amphibious assault ship *USS Bataan (LHD 5)* moved out of dry dock to her new berth at Norfolk Naval Shipyard (NNSY) Feb. 7 as part of her depot planned maintenance availability (DPMA).

The movement is part of the DPMA plan, which is to refurbish spaces and install new components and systems aboard the ship.

"It was a race to the finish," said the ship's Repair Officer, Lt. Cmdr. David Wuestewald. "The last fuel tank closure was being completed the afternoon prior to the dock's flooding."

Bataan has been at NNSY since September, and contractors and Bataan's crew have been working on various modifications and habitability projects, such as the MV-22 Osprey modification in the hangar bay, and installation of a compensating fuel system.

"We are done with most of the modifications aboard the ship," said Wuestewald. "Now the main focus will be touch-up work around the ship."

Moving the ship out of the dry dock facility to the pier was a major evolution for the ship's crew and Norfolk Naval Shipyard personnel, taking more than eight hours.

"It was exciting getting the CIC [Combat Information Center] manned and ready for the evolution," said Senior Chief Operations Specialist (SW/AW) William J. Phillips. "Having water under the keel again means that at-sea operations are right around the corner"

The crew aboard the ship had various responsibilities during the move, including standing watches, inspecting for watertight integrity around the ship's hull and line handling. Meanwhile, shipyard personnel were responsible for the controlled flooding of the dock, moving the dry dock's caisson and orchestrating the ship's movement.

"This was a major milestone in the DPMA," added Wuestewald. "Now we look forward to the production completion date, crew move-aboard and light-off assessment."

Bataan is more than halfway through her eight-month DPMA period. Bataan is the fifth ship of the Navy's Wasp-class ships. She was commissioned Sept. 20, 1997, and is the second U.S. Navy warship to bear the name.

Master Chief Tubbs enlisted in the U.S. Navy on Nov. 17, 1982. Upon completion of recruit training and Hospital Corps "A" School in San Diego, he reported for duty, aboard Bethesda Naval Hospital. In May 1985, Master Chief Tubbs was transferred to 2d Force Service Support Group, Det "B". Beaufort, SC. where

he was advanced to Second Class Petty Officer.

After reenlisting in 1987, Master Chief Tubbs reported to Charleston Naval Hospital. During DESERT SHIELD/DESERT STORM, he deployed with 3rd Battalion/5th Marines, 1st Marine Division. In the summer of 1992, he transferred to USS FRANK CABLE (AS 40) where he would qualify as an Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist and earn the rank of Chief Petty Officer.

In 1995, he reported to Surgical Support Company Bravo (SSCOB), 4th Medical Battalion, 4th FSSG, Washington, DC, for duty as Inspector-Instructor. In June 1998, Master Chief Tubbs transferred to 2d FSSG, Camp Lejeune, NC to serve as the Medical Detachment SNCOIC. While there, he served with the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operation Capable) for operations in Kosovo, Albania and Turkey. Upon return to Camp Lejeune, Master Chief Tubbs was assigned to Headquarters and Support Battalion, 2d FSSG, as a member of the G-3 staff. During this period, he was selected for promotion to Senior Chief Petty Officer.

Master Chief Tubbs received orders to 10th Marine Regiment, 2d Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, in the summer of 2001, as the Regimental Senior Chief. Ten months into his tour, he was reassigned to the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit. Master Chief Tubbs accompanied the 26th MEU(SOC) aboard the USS IWO JIMA (LHD 7) and inserted into Iraq, Djibouti and Liberia; he was selected for promotion to Master Chief Petty Officer at this time. In December 2003, Master Chief Tubbs transferred to the 4th Marine Expeditionary Brigade (Anti-Terrorism) as the G-4/Medical OPS Chief and Command Master Chief. In May 2004, he reported to Naval Hospital Camp Lejeune as the Command Master Chief. On Jan. 3, 2007, Master Chief Tubbs assumed the duty as Command Master Chief. USS BATAAN (LHD 5).

Master Chief Tubbs has been awarded the Meritorious Service Medal, five Navy/ Marine Corps Commendation medals, two Navy/Marine Corps Achievement medals, three Combat Action Ribbons, and various other unit and campaign awards.
